





Abstract: We are very happy to have received today two women who continue to add loud and clear to the fight against trafficking. We have been visited today by the magistrate Leyre González, assigned to the Court of Violence against Women No. 1 of Fuenlabrada, together with Pilar Martinez, Social Worker Coordinator of the Trafficking Unit of the Directorate General for Equality of the Community of Madrid. The visit is part of the Training Plan for members of the judiciary who are assigned to Courts of Violence against Women or with competence in this area and responds to the collaboration program of the Directorate General for Equality of the Community of Madrid in the area of training with the General Council of the Judiciary. The visit aimed to share and inform the magistrate about the Network of Comprehensive Care for Gender Violence of the Community of Madrid and, specifically, the Resource of Comprehensive Care for Women Victims of Human Trafficking for Sexual Exploitation that we manage at Proyecto Esperanza. We have met with her from the Area of Awareness and Advocacy and the Area of Intervention from the Legal Service, the Comprehensive Health Service, and the Social Integration Service. Throughout the meeting, we have provided her with information about the resource, the circumstances of the women we attend and we have analyzed, among other issues, the legal difficulties we encounter in our work. We are very grateful for the visit and the opportunity for exchange and mutual learning that these types of meetings provide.

Abstract: Last Sunday the women residents of our specialized resource against human trafficking spent the day at feria bio-culture, which promotes ecology and responsible consumption. The educational aim of participating in this type of activity is to raise awareness of the natural resources available and to generate in them critical thinking about the environment by reducing their ecological footprint as indicated in Goal 12 of the ODSs of the 2030 Agenda: "Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns". Did you know?

Every year, an estimated one-third of all food produced (the equivalent of 1.3 billion tons worth close to \$1 trillion) ends up rotting in consumer and retailer bins or spoiling due to poor transport and collection practices.

If everyone replaced their light bulbs with energy-efficient ones, it would save USD 12 billion a year.

Should the world's population reach 9.6 billion people in 2050, the equivalent of almost three planets could be needed to provide the natural resources needed to maintain current lifestyles?

This section offers accounts, stories, and cases of recovery from the real protagonists, the women who have suffered first-hand from trafficking for exploitation and who, with enormous courage, bravery and generosity, provide us with invaluable information to understand this phenomenon and to be able to combat it.

- ⇒ Human trafficking is a human rights violation that has a global impact and, as a global problem, requires global solutions.
- ⇒ Given the diversity and complexity of the phenomenon of trafficking, and to understand it and make it visible to its full extent, we offer a comprehensive way to consult the stories of survivors.
- ⇒ Not only because of the type of exploitation but also because of the interconnection with other phenomena such as asylum and other extreme forms of gender-based violence.

We want to contribute to generating deep reflections on the consequences of this human rights violation and a critical view on the impact on the victims of this crime of the strategy and approach we choose to address it.

Abstract: Yesterday afternoon we attended the Recognition given by the Guardia Civil in the Fight against Violence against Women on the occasion of the 25th of November. We would like to congratulate and convey our most sincere congratulations to the award winners among which are:

- ⇒ Civil Guards for their work in the prevention and protection of women victims of violence.
- ⇒ In the field of collectives, entities, or institutions, recognition was given to APRAMP, which works for the liberation and reintegration of women who are prostitutes and victims of human trafficking networks.
- ⇒ In the field of education, the Campaign Against Abuse: Zero Tolerance, by the Mutua Madrileña Foundation and Antena 3 Noticias, a social awareness-raising initiative that has been fighting against this scourge for six years, were highlighted.

Abstract: Last October, the Provincial Council of the Adorers of the Province of Spain appointed Iris Rodríguez as director of Proyecto ESPERANZA Adoratrices, a social worker dedicated to offering specialized and comprehensive support to victims of human trafficking for exploitation. In a statement addressed to the team, the new director confirms her "availability to take on this new challenge of leadership and a renewed commitment to the women we serve". A service that she assumes with joy and enthusiasm and she says "all together we can continue to advance in the purpose initiated in 1999".

Furthermore, Iris expresses her hope that "we will continue to make progress in the prevention and protection of the rights of women who suffer this crime and to strengthen even more the links and networking as a strategy to eradicate this scourge".

Today, she states, as she did more than 22 years ago, that "fighting one of the most extreme forms of gender-based violence remains a challenge, but it is also an exciting challenge to which we can and must continue to respond with responsibility and solidarity".

Abstract: Today we participated in the meeting of the European civil society platform against trafficking. It is the first meeting with Diane Schmitt who was appointed a few months ago as the new European Anti -Trafficking Coordinator. One of the key issues at the moment is the evaluation of the implementation of the European counter trafficking directive with the following objectives:

- ⇒ To evaluate the implementation and the effectiveness, efficiency, relevance, coherence, and EU added value of the Anti-Trafficking Directive.
- ⇒ Identify possible gaps and shortcomings in the current framework.
- ⇒ To make recommendations for possible future measures, including those of a legislative nature, to address these gaps.
- ⇒ To assess the impact of such measures given a possible revision of the Anti-Trafficking Directive.

To achieve the objectives described above the research team will carry out at least six different data collection activities, which will inform the three phases of the study. Data collection includes:

- ⇒ Documental investigation or Research at national and international / EU level.
- ⇒ Online survey with Member States' national law enforcement agencies, judicial authorities, national civil society organizations, national reporters, national institutions responsible for social services.
- ⇒ Targeted interviews with EU agencies, European civil society organizations, Businesses and employers, international bodies, and academics/experts.
- ⇒ Online public consultation.
- ⇒ Stakeholder meetings/workshops
- \Rightarrow Summary of comments received on the initial impact roadmap of the evaluation of the Directive.

Abstract: As of 1 January 2022, the government will count the fatal victims of all-male violence, not only femicides perpetrated by intimate partners or ex-partners. The murders of women due to sexual violence and sexual exploitation will therefore be counted by the Government Delegation against Gender Violence in a more comprehensive statistic than the one that has been produced since 2003, which only takes into account women killed by their partners or ex-partners.
