Introduction



The International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women is celebrated on 25 November to raise awareness of violence against women and girls worldwide.

It is intended to encourage the implementation of policies by the nations of the world to eradicate gender-based violence, as well as to provide support and raise awareness about the ongoing stigmatization and shame suffered by victims.

The origin of this International Day dates back to 2000, when the UN General Assembly designated 25 November as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, inviting governments, international organizations and NGOs to get involved and coordinate actions to raise public awareness to eliminate all forms of violence against women.

As the main antecedent of this event, since 1981 militants and activists in favour of women's rights have observed 25 November as a day of protest and commemoration against gender violence.

The date of this International Day against Violence against Women was chosen to honor the memory of the Mirabal sisters, three political activists from the Dominican Republic who were brutally murdered in 1960 on the orders of the Dominican dictator Rafael Trujillo.

Abstract: On the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, Adorers insists on the need to apply the gender perspective, human rights and the intersectional approach, both to prevent and to respond to the different forms of gender-based violence. Through its Obra Social and the @fundacionamaranta, it develops 28 comprehensive intervention programs in Spain with women victims of domestic violence, victims of trafficking and women in situations of exclusion in contexts of prostitution, among other realities. Gender violence has a profound impact on the integral health of women. The intervention and work methodology of the Adorers' projects are characterized by a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach, which promotes the integral recovery, autonomy and social inclusion of the people they accompany.

Abstract: Today we attended the awards ceremony of the @comunidadmadrid on the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women. We continue to join forces and network today and always. In 2005, Law 5/2005, of 20 December 2005, Integral Law against Gender Violence of the Community of Madrid was approved. This law recognizes trafficking in women for the purpose of sexual exploitation as one of the forms of gender violence. The autonomic administration acquires the obligation, under the framework of this law, to provide a comprehensive response to women victims of trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation. In 2007, Project Esperanza was awarded the contract for the running of the first Comprehensive Care Resource for Women Victims of Trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation, which is part of the Network of Care Centres for Women in the Community of Madrid. This resource, staffed by specialized professionals (social workers, social educators, psychologists, lawyers, mediators and employment technicians), offers shelter places in conditions of anonymity and security, as well as specialized care and advice from a Day Centre.
