

Abstract: The pre-employment workshop in alliance with Wanawake Mujer continues as every Wednesday with the four women survivors of trafficking for the purpose of exploitation that integrate it. One of the parts that we work with them, within the project "Maua, flowers for equality", is to make their reality visible through the flowers that help to end it, like our petals against Female Genital Mutilation. They know that they are part of this project, and they live it as such, putting enthusiasm and affection in what they do. Abstract: A year ago, on #EuropeanDayofVictimsofCrime we published a lot of documentation of the REST project that offers strengthened Protection for Victims of Trafficking through the granting of a residence permit and/or international protection status.

Here are some key ideas:

- The granting of a residence permit to victims of trafficking is a way to guarantee their dignity and access to justice.
- It provides them with the minimum security and stability necessary to achieve their full recovery. However, the implementation of international and European standards in this regard remains very limited and deficient.
- Most EU countries grant a very low number of permanent residence permits and/or international protection to victims of trafficking.
- Furthermore, refoulement under the Dublin III Regulation, within the framework of the Common European Asylum System, and expulsions to countries of origin violate the duty to protect trafficked persons in the long term and may result in the risk that they may be subjected to inhuman or degrading treatment under Article 4 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union.

Recomendaciones

Abstract: Do you know our approach principles? Women survivors of trafficking have a cultural and value baggage that constructs them and gives them identity. We do not pretend to replace or reconstruct identities but to allow them to permeate and empower their capacities for inclusion in society. This is how we understand our intervention, in an ENHANCING way. It is essential to strengthen the relationship through knowledge and mutual understanding, acceptance, empathy, and the establishment of clear limits, based on the following methodological principles: legality and human rights, women as protagonists of the process, flexibility, volunteering, respect for individuality, empowering intervention, interdisciplinarity, integrated intervention in networks, non-revictimization. Abstract: We start the week and the Monday with strength, with enthusiasm and with the attitude that women transmit to us. Their strength, bravery and courage are an example to keep our purpose alive. We already told this in a webinar back in 2002 about Revictimization Vs Resilience. RESILIENCE means acknowledging the capacity of women to project themselves into the future, to generate realistic and positive hopes, to turn traumatic experiences into learning and to interpret them from the point of view of the capacity to overcome them. It implies that, from the beginning of the intervention, a positive view of women must be taken as a starting point, by recognizing them as strong, capable, courageous people, with specific problems at a specific moment in time, with projects and possibilities. Resilience is a dynamic process that is subject to factors that depend on the woman and her life trajectory and to factors that have to do with the environment, such as the possibilities of integration and the support she can count on in her recovery process. It is on this last point that we must become aware of the crucial role played by those of us who, directly or indirectly, act and intervene in her recovery process. Much literature, discourse and analysis is still relevant in 2022. Don't miss the information in the link!


