Abstract: We would like to thank the programme @toleranciacerorne for the participation they gave us last Friday in their programme on the sexual exploitation of minors under custody, and the recently approved action plan against this type of abuse, after numerous cases have come to light in recent years in Madrid, the Balearic Islands, the Canary Islands and Valencia, among other communities. Our Awareness and Advocacy Coordinator talked with Alba Urrutia about the current situation and the focus on tougher penalties for victims of trafficking who are refugees from the war in Ukraine, a clause that will be introduced in the Penal Code. We were able to provide the guides we have prepared in the framework of #TIATAS, as well as the recent training we gave to CREADE authorities in Pozuelo and the awareness-raising activities and the emergency telephone number set up. Abstract: We would like to share the live space offered to us by @Cadena SER er to make human trafficking more visible thanks to Miriam's testimonial and the interview they did with our Awareness and Advocacy Coordinator on 15 May. "They hardly gave us anything to eat. We had to work every day without a break, even when we were sick they forced us to attend to the clients". This is how Miriam (not her real name) explains the hell she suffered in the brothel where she was held captive for a year and where her dreams were cut short. She had a challenge and set out on a journey. She dreamed of having a better life and earning money to, among other things, help her sick mother. "Making a way there was very complicated, the lack of work, crime and insecurity made it very difficult to prosper. She was 18 years old. She arrived in Spain in 2013 from El Salvador but plans did not go as planned. Once here, she started working as a babysitter but that didn't last long so she started looking through the thousands of adverts circulating on the internet until she found one that fitted her profile: "Girl needed for cleaning". That offer was a trap, the bait of a sexual exploitation network.
