

Our objective is to promote social and labor incorporation where work is a key element for their integration and autonomy. But sometimes, it is important to start with basic support so that they can access studies. From that point of support, they begin their recovery itinerary.

Learning the language, accessing their first job, and knowing their labor rights, can allow them to have better working conditions and thus be able to resume their migration project. Education and training are key to ensuring that targeted women have access to more opportunities in our cultural environment.

Abstract: It's not just what we do but HOW WE DO IT. The creation of the link is key to generating warmth in the intervention with victims of trafficking. For this reason, we carry out individualized attention, divided into phases and with group support that enriches diversity as a source of wealth. The needs posed by women users of the resource are assessed and addressed in a joint, coordinated, and scheduled manner by the different professional, health, psychological, legal, educational, social, and labor services, to build and implement a comprehensive, dynamic process. and evaluated where women are the main agents of change. From the acceptance of diversity, an intervention based on individualized attention is carried out. Each case is unique and it is necessary to take into account the specific characteristics and circumstances of each of the women and their relationship with the environment. Through direct communication through interviews, group work, or in the different dynamics of coexistence, a bond of trust is created, a context of mutual understanding and respect through which to establish the relationship of help that enables change and personal development. We also want to create a bond with you, with all the people who read, follow and share our posts. That is our commitment. Provide value and knowledge about trafficking.

Abstract: Today we want to talk to you about the structural causes of trafficking in women. Violence against women and gender inequalities are identified and recognized as one of the causes of trafficking in the UE Strategy towards the Eradication of Trafficking in Human Beings 2012-2016. Some of the causes that lead to Trafficking in Women are:

- Machismo and culture of violence against women: Those values, practices, and unequal power relations that legitimize and justify control and violence over women, based on the supposed superiority of men.
- Feminization of poverty: Women in the world are more vulnerable to impoverishment processes as a consequence of the gender roles that have been assigned to them and the different positions in a society of men and women.
- Inequality in access to education and training for girls compared to boys.
- Discrimination in access to the labor market leads women to less qualified, lower paid, and more unprotected jobs.
- Lack of co-responsibility in care In many cultures, women have to assume all the responsibility for the upbringing, education, and maintenance of their sons and daughters alone in the absence of co -responsibility of the parents.

Abstract: If we do not know the real magnitude of human trafficking, it is difficult to eradicate it. The lack of figures in everything that refers to violence against women is one more example of the indifference and lack of political attention that these situations generate in our cultural and political environment. The analysis of the phenomenon of trafficking is very complex. The international organizations that investigate and act in this area have fragmented data and different estimates, which must be handled with great caution. There is no clarity or agreement on the figures. There is a very important difficulty that lies in the complete absence of systematized data and reliable statistical information that provides a global and clear vision of the issue. There is a lack of consistent, reliable, and comparable data due to:

- Trafficking is a hidden criminal reality, difficult to discover.
- The different national definitions of the crime of trafficking and the different definitions of a victim of trafficking that are used lead to confusion and do not allow for consistent data collection.
- The lack of investment to research the problem and the lack of political will to place this scourge as a priority on the political agenda with the necessary budget allocation makes it even more difficult to quantify the reality of the problem and systematize data collection.
- Most of the data refer to trafficking for sexual exploitation. However, other forms of trafficking, for labor exploitation, begging, forced marriages, or the commission of criminal activities, remain hidden and invisible in most cases.

Vinader (Sj) gave the following testimony: "Amid the acute pains she prayed, and it can be truly said that she did not stop praying for a moment the whole time of her illness lasted... not a moment she ceased to be in the presence of God" At five minutes to midnight, as she had prophesied, ("At 12 nothing will hurt me anymore") she gave his soul to the Lord. Shortly before she died, her words were heard: "Pedro, open the other half, I have to go in accompanied, I don't have to be alone." Indeed, at the same time, another Sister and two schoolgirls died. 
